	National Mid-Winter Recap —Student Officers Student Officers presented a wonderful video presentation on all of the things they enjoyed about MWM in Branson MO. They thanked the board for the wonderful opportunity to go and

learn how the association works on a national level.

Jr High and HS Officers also showed a slide show presentation on all of the things they have accomplished so far this season. We have a great group of student officer who are represented our association well.

Kelly Anderson reported on MWM in Branson and thanked the Student Officers for representing our association so well at Mid-Winter meetings.

Kelly reported that National Finals in Rock Springs, WY will not have enough camping for everyone. There will need to be a lottery type drawing to see who will get the full hook up camping spots. Contestants with horses will get first priority but will not be guaranteed a spot. Shooters and Rough Stock Riders will not be eligible for full hook up camping in Rock Springs. We have been allotted 41 Camp Spots and in years past have had approx. 66 contestants.

All National Camp Sites are 50 amp so please plan to bring an adapter. All RV spots are back in with sewer on the driver's side. Please plan ahead if you need additional sewer hoses. Full hook ups will be \$395.50 – Dry Camping will be \$197.75

National Reported that they had a hard time securing a contract for golf carts for the NHSFR. Nationals will be using 2 vendors $-650~1^{\rm st}$ vendors when those are gone the $2^{\rm nd}$ vendor will bring 100 more. Once all golf carts are sold out - Contestants will be allowed to bring their own golf cart but will be required to pay a fee and have a sticker on the golf cart that shows you have it registered with the facility.

Rule was made and will be enforced. Only parents and guardians/chaperons 21 years old and up will be allowed to drive a golf cart. No exceptions — contestants will be disqualified and sent home. No warnings

They made it very clear at National MWM there will be no exceptions when it comes to the golf carts. Contestants will be sent home. We would hate to see it be any of our Utah families sent home.

DISCUSSION	Jason welcomed everyone and reminded the board to please keep in mind during breakouts that we need to be mindful to make decisions for what is best for the association as a whole as we are discussing things in committee. He thanked the Student Officers for all they do for the association. Jason also read the Member/Parents social media agreement that all members/parents sign to be part of this association. As a condition of membership in UHSRA, the undersigned understands that the UHSRA requires students and parents to agree not to post online any comments about the NHSRA, the UHSRA, and/or its official representatives that are inaccurate, detrimental, threatening, harassing, and/or derogatory, as well as to agree not to create unauthorized websites and social media accounts utilizing the Association name, whether directly or indirectly. We further understand that failure to abide by this agreement by either adult members, parent(s) or student member(s) will result in the immediate revocation of all the undersigned's adult and student memberships in the UHSRA, including any points awarded in the current rodeo season.
	Wasatch Jr High Club proposal – Justin Sharp presented to the board about the possibility of creating a Wasatch Jr High rodeo club. A large number of members live in the Wasatch Co area and want to see a local Jr High club. They are proposing to use the same weekend as the High School Club in May. Justin's presentation touched on the opportunity to utilize the Wasatch Co facility that is equipped to handle JH/HS rodeo and also mentioned that the High School club is willing to help them out as they are building the Jr High club. Justin mentioned that they anticipate 20-30 members. Justin thanked the board for the opportunity to present. This item was tabled until the general meeting
	Planning and Steering Committee Meeting Discussed 2024-2025 Rodeo Season Motion to approve the proposed schedule by Gentry Goza 2 nd by Tana Bennett – Montion passes in Committee Student officers asked about possible sponsors for the Rodeo News.
	Student officer ask to please send member spotlights to them to share on social media Brock Riding brought up concerns with clubs dropping their date and then wanting it back in the schedule. He would like to see it where if a club does not host for any given reason and someone takes over that date the club who gave up that date would need to wait until a date become available before they could get back on the schedule. No motions made
	Gentry Goza presented concerns about the current point system. She would like to bring more points into State Finals. She asked if a committee could be put together to look at the points system and present a proposal to have the point system changed.
	Kadence Martin would like to have a committee to evaluate the possibility to add another round at State Finals. She would also like to have a committee to look into this and possibly put to together a proposal to add another Round to State Finals. Jason approved the idea of having a committee to look at both girls' ideas and present their findings and proposals to the board.

Keith Nellesen presented with concerns about the current UHSRA rule to rake no less then 7 no more then 10. Mr. Nellesen proposes no less then 5 no more than 7 rakes. In his presentation he handed out a packet of information to the board of directors to support his concerns.

Also handed out during the presentation was a letter from Dr. Beau Beck DVM South Valley Equine expressing his support for more rakes. The topic was brought up for consideration of implementing a paid position of a Ground Judge to evaluate and help facilities incorporate changes to improve ground. Kelly Anderson stated that this job could just be added to the director assigned to the rodeo.

Lacey Morse and Mike Schultz presented to the planning and steering committee a proposal that would place a mandatory jackpot for 50% of the High School rodeos each season. This jackpot would be a 2D jackpot that would allow of more contestants an opportunity to see a payout. Mrs. Morse handed out a breakdown of what this 2D jackpot would have looked like at two of our past rodeos this season So Summit #1 and Dixie #6. The proposal would have the 50% mandatory rodeos drawn for prior to the season starting and keep the current optional jackpotting in place for the other 50%. 2D pay out with a 2 second split in all events. 1D 60 % payout and 2D 40% payout

Rough Stock/Livestock

Jason Riding - Timed Event

- No complaints, however, with the price of beef there is a struggle with getting cattle, and the committee can't be too picky. Cattle are going \$800-\$1,200 per cow.
- New Change for next year ZD Cattle wants to increase from \$15 per run to \$20 per run.
 - o Propose to the board a \$5 increase per entry for every event to help the clubs with the cost of cattle.
- The next few years may need to be in the same boat as cattle prices could be high.

Brad McKee - Rough Stock

- Proposing to have a point system for the Rough Stock riders to help increase the number of participants.
 - o 1-JV
 - o 2 Average HS Contestant
 - 3 Advanced with better stock
- We would widdle the contractors down to a certain number of rodeos

- This would require Pick-up Men and Bullfighters to also have a certain amount of years of experience.
- There would be a flat fee for Stock Contractors that would include travel
 - This fee has been discussed at \$7,500

Holly Jacobs questioned if there was a way to allocate a percentage of the Rainy-Day Fund or the Late Fee Fund to go towards creating more schools for all events.

It was also discussed that in order to be on the "approved stock contractor" list, we should require the contractors to provide stock for a school(s). This gives the Livestock Committee the opportunity to watch their stock and can approve/deny their stock.

After the year, how does someone new get onto the approved list? - An idea would be having them host a school to evaluate their stock could be a requirement.

Kadie Nielson stated during the Rough Stock school to have students come watch and listen, but still charge them an "entry" fee. E.G. \$50 per person that wants to come listen to the instructors from the stands. They wouldn't be allowed to participate, just listen.

Brad suggested the cap for the Rough Stock school would be 15.

Matt Cumbie suggested the cap for Team Roping school would be 6 per instructor. This could be broken into Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced schools for all timed events, and 6 per level would be the cap.

Kena Frey questioned the cattle for the Reigning Cow and Cutting cattle. She stated they are not always the same.

There was discussion about increasing the fees due to the cattle prices, and possibly of a person(s) who would be over a cattle contract. E.G. someone the secretaries could reach out to, and they would be able to find the proper cattle for both events.
